How does the application process work?

The Summit is open to all neighbors interested in learning more about advocacy as a tool, and other systemic issues connected to food insecurity. You can find the application link on the Power Summit landing page. After applying, all applications will be reviewed by the Neighbor Advisory Council. Applicants will be selected based on meaningful interest and commitment to attending the Summit, through their responses.

I need help applying. Who can I contact?

When will I be notified if I can attend the Power Summit?

The Power Summit Application is set to close April 27th, 2026. If selected, you will receive an email from the Advocacy Team to confirm you have been selected to join the Summit, by May 2026. Emails will be sent out on the week of May 4th.

How much am I eligible to receive as a Power Summit participant?

As a participant, you will be eligible to receive a stipend of \$400 for attending the 2-day in-person Summit.

When will I receive the stipend?

Participants will receive their stipend on the final day of the Summit.

Do I need to report the stipend?

Participants are responsible for reporting the stipend on their own.

I am coming from outside of Tucson. Can I be compensated for accommodation and/or travel?

Participants who travel more than 50 miles to attend the Summit will be compensated for their mileage and will be provided with lodging at no cost. Please be sure to indicate this accommodation on the confirmation form, so we can contact you with further details.
